Topic: Racing set to resume at NMIT Kyneton Park

Dear Trainers,

The rectification works currently being undertaken to drainage system for the grass track is nearing completion. These works primarily relate to the removal of sand (washed down the drainage system by the storm/flood) which was blocking the drainage system and repair of severed aggie pipes. This means that safety related concerns/issues associated with the grass track will have been rectified by the end of next week and the track will be ready to reopen in around one month. The next month is required to ensure the surface has adequate time to re-establish following excavation works and to ensure the surface is in great order for the 24th May and beyond. The exact date of when the grass will be opened for grass gallops will be made in late April/Early May and once a decision has been made this will be communicated to trainers.

Recent works have brought to our attention that our current aggie system is in average to poor condition (not fully operational) and the Club will need to look at upgrading the drainage system at an appropriate time within the next few years. Over the next month or two the Club will work with RVL to formulate a "scope of works and time frame" for upgrading of the drainage system. Once a time frame has been agreed we will send out a notification.

The Club wishes to thank trainers for your understanding, adaptability and support shown during this difficult period which has impacted all of us.
